SUBJECTS AND ACADEMIC PATHWAYS

All International Students must do an English language course.

To attend a New Zealand University, a student will also need to get a minimum of NCEA Level 1 in Maths as well as UE Literacy in EAP / English. Students will be entered into subjects once they have met the prerequisites, or at the Head of Faculty's discretion.



STUDYING AT LONG BAY COLLEGE

ACADEMIC YEAR

- The academic year at Long Bay College is divided into 4 terms, each of approximately 10 weeks.
- The school year starts late January/early February.
- Each term is separated by a 2 week break.
- Holiday Academy will run during the 2 week breaks, so students can continue progressing in English.
- During Senior study leave, an additional End of Year Programme is offered for Senior Internationals till early December.
- The academic year ends early/mid December, though Seniors will have study leave to prepare for exams from early November.

ORIENTATION

International Orientation runs before classes start. New students will meet the International team, undergo an Initial Placement Test to determine English levels, choose a timetable, see what life is like at school and in the community, and enjoy socialising with fellow students.



NCEA COURSES

(NATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT) AND PATHWAYS TO TERTIARY STUDY

New Zealand's National Certificates of Educational Achievement (NCEA) are national qualifications for senior secondary school students.

NCEA challenges students of all abilities to acquire skills and knowledge. It enables students to gain credits from both traditional school curriculum areas and alternative programmes.

Developing creativity and skills of analysis, reasoning and evaluation, as well as working independently or within a group, are all important parts of NCEA to prepare students for university and a rapidly changing world.

There are two forms of testing of NCEA: Externals (examinations at the end of the year) and Internals (projects and assessments throughout the year).

The International Dean works closely with the Head of EAP and the Careers Dean to ensure that all students have relevant timetables which create pathways to university and the world of work.

ACADEMY

Long Bay College also offers a supplementary English language programme both after school and in the holidays.

Academy classes are small and focused. IELTS classes are also offered. Tutors are experienced and cater for all levels of English, reinforcing the learning students do in class during the school day.

All Academy classes are available at a small extra charge. A price list is available on request.

UNIVERSITY PREPARATION ADVANCED ENGLISH COURSE

Long Bay College also works alongside Massey University to offer students a Foundation Course. These classes take place at the Long Bay College campus and help accelerate pathways to University.

END OF YEAR PROGRAMME

Our End of Year Programme for Senior students is available in November once Study Leave starts for NCEA Externals.

Long Bay College offers a combination of workshops from a range of subjects across the school to provide students with the opportunity to get a taste of New Zealand subjects they wouldn't normally experience.

ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES (EAP)

Long Bay College provides cutting-edge courses for all English language learners, based on individual needs and chosen pathways.

Effective and relevant programmes help students to become confident and proficient in English. By studying at Long Bay College, students are not only supported in everyday life in New Zealand, but are also able to access the entire curriculum at the school and be successful in their academic studies.

EAP courses have been carefully designed to provide the framework for language learning, as well as the skills required to achieve at NCEA. All levels of English are catered for, from Beginners to Advanced. Many courses are also NCEA accredited and provide a pathway to University Entrance literacy.

All students will be assessed for English levels on arrival. Progress will then be carefully monitored, and the EAP teacher, along with the Head of EAP, will regularly review language levels.

All EAP classes are taught in a positive, inclusive learning environment. Dedicated teachers will get to know students well and will also support them in their studies, pastoral concerns and academic pathways.

ENGLISH

The English curriculum is designed to assist students in acquiring the language skills they need to function effectively in a highly literate, often multi-lingual society. English literature is also explored in some programmes.

LANGUAGES

The Languages Faculty offers study in:

- Te Reo Maori
- French
- Chinese (Mandarin)

Classes from Year 9 to Year 13 focus on building progressively more sophisticated communication skills and incorporate the study of culture and tradition. Students in language classes may also have the opportunity to participate in competitions and trips where the target language is spoken.

English for Academic Purposes (EAP) is a subject that Long Bay College students, international or domestic, take to improve their English-speaking skills, as well as their writing and reading, if English is an additional language for them. This subject provides them with the necessary skill-set that enables them to do well and succeed in other English enriched subjects. Since I came to New Zealand, doing EAP at Long Bay College has been the most helpful subject I take, as it not only helps me communicate better with the people around me, but it also prepares me with the appropriate vocabulary and knowledge for my other subjects.

MATHEMATICS

The focus of the Mathematics Faculty is the academic success of students, with dedicated teachers working with the most up-to-date technology.

Subjects on offer depend on the year level at which the student is studying. They include:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Earth and Space Science

- Science External
- Science Internal

SOCIAL SCIENCE



The Social Science Faculty focuses on how societies work and how people can participate as critical, active, informed and responsible citizens. Contexts are drawn from the past, present and future and from places within and outside New Zealand, preparing students for an understanding of the physical and cultural world around them. Subjects on offer depend on the year level at which the student is studying. They include:

- Classics
- Geography
- History
- Media Studies
- Social Science
- Tourism

In Brazil I studied Geography for 5 years and I got very bored, because I learnt about general geography without any focus on the geography in Brazil. Here in New Zealand we study things that we see every day, and after we've spoken about it in school we go to visit the places we spoke about. So here in New Zealand we mix the practical with the theoretical and I really like that!

TECHNOLOGY

This dynamic, high profile faculty offers a wide range of practical subjects in state of the art facilities, including a Design and Visual Communication department which is recognised as one of the best in New Zealand. NCEA and competition success feature regularly, with students gaining some of the top awards locally and nationally. Subjects on offer depend on the year level at which the student is studying. They include:

- Engineering
- Electronics

- Food Technology
- Digital Technologies
- Design and Visual Communications

The students design a product or architecture while presenting the details in a portfolio of the design process, the implementation and the evaluation. VISUAL ARTS

The Visual Arts faculty has customised facilities and expert teaching staff. It caters for students' creative learning from Year 9 through to Year 13, enabling students to develop a high standard of art and a strong understanding of visual communications techniques. ACCOMMODATION

When you are away from home, living with a locally based family is a great way to settle in, feel at home, make new friends and experience New Zealand student life to the full. The homestay accommodation offers a supportive family environment.

All International students live with a Long Bay College approved homestay family unless living with their natural parents or a member of their family (a designated caregiver). Students are not allowed to live independently. All families are checked by our Homestay Coordinator before hosting a student, and careful monitoring is undertaken throughout each student's stay. All students have their own bedroom and are expected to live as a part of the family.

Looking after the wellbeing of a student is a high priority. Our Homestay Coordinator is available Monday to Friday, 8am to 3pm for all Homestay issues.

I have been living with my homestay family for one year now. It is the first time I have lived with people who come from a different country. At first, I was a little bit nervous, because I was not good at English and I was homesick, but I really liked my homestay family. They gave me an opportunity to improve my English skills and to be a more positive person. We are a really good family now and we respect each other's cultures. STUDENT SERVICES

Long Bay College offers comprehensive student services and support, designed to make the transition to New Zealand an easy one and help students make the most of College life.

PASTORAL CARE AND SUPPORT

Long Bay College has an International Department of experienced and dedicated staff. The department includes the Deputy Principal International, International Dean, Homestay Coordinator, International Student Administrator and International Finance Administrator. Chinese and Korean speaking staff are also available to support. The Deputy Principal (International) and International Dean oversee the welfare and academic progress of all International students.

The Careers Dean and Guidance Counsellors also support students with pathway and subject choices, as well as emotional challenges.

In addition, the International Prefects organise social and sporting events, including movie nights, games nights and craft days. The Orientation team, alongside International staff, also provides support to newcomers.

Qualified EAP (English for Academic Purposes) teachers provide English language support for all International students. Students will get to know these teachers really well and may choose to turn to one of them if additional support is required.

SPORTS OVERVIEW

Sporting activities at Long Bay College are a great way for students to improve their English, learn more about themselves, discover new interests, build strong friendships and leadership skills for the future.

Regardless of whether students are in the top team or a social team, specialist staff and coaches from the community support the programmes which are modified to suit different sporting levels, ages and abilities.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Long Bay College caters for all academic levels leading to NCEA. The school has a student-centred approach to enable all students to develop their talents and reach their full potential.

The main criteria includes a positive attitude with a readiness to learn and an openness to trying out new ways, and realistic expectations of achievements depending on natural ability and the time frame set by each International student and their family.

In terms of English, Long Bay College caters for all levels of language with its EAP programmes. Students working at Foundation Stage (English Language Learning Progressions) will receive an intensive, full-time EAP programme before they are permitted to join other mainstream subjects. This is to ensure that all students are set up for success, as virtually all mainstream classes are taught in English. Once progress in English has been made, students will move into mainstream subjects in addition.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To make the process easy, here is a simple outline of the steps to follow to apply to study at Long Bay College. Please submit an application at least three months before the term starts.

1. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

To enrol online, please visit www.longbaycollege.com to find and complete the application form. An email will be sent when the application is received.

2. FIND OUT IF YOUR APPLICATION HAS BEEN ACCEPTED

Successful applicants will receive a Conditional Offer of Place, which will include an invoice for all fees owing.

3. PAY YOUR FEES

4. RECEIVE A CONFIRMED OFFER OF PLACE AND RECEIPT OF PAYMENT

With a confirmed offer, students will also receive your Pre-Arrival pack, which will include a pre-departure checklist and further information about how to make the transition and be successful in New Zealand. A link to our English language preparation course and the Orientation Day (first day) schedule will be provided.

Details of homestay family and accommodation (where appropriate) and airport transfer will follow nearer the time of departure.

5. APPLY FOR YOUR STUDENT VISA
